


ASH FORK WATER MAIN

- Redundant Critical Infrastructure
- Economic Growth (Pilot, Family Dollar)
- Make Inadequate System Adequate (school, and others needed individual storage tanks)
- Fire Water Availability
- Core System with Extension Capabilities

Project Accomplishments

- Looped Main Line System (two main lines enter town on opposite ends)
- Standpipe Flow increased from 84 to 97 gpm
- Sufficient water for commercial development without special provisions
