Review and approval of notes from 12.10.2021	Ross made a motion to approve, Maria-Elena seconded. Notes were approved.
Legislative Update	Joan provided a Legislative update—39 days into the sessions. The Housing Coalition goes through
	all the bills how it impacts housing, employment, and access to care. Housing Coalition has
	legislative priorities:
	• Looking to secure an annual allocation for the Housing Trust Fund—the HTF is more flexible—currently capped at \$2.5 million was at one time \$40 million. Couple of bills dropped to create

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	 new funding streams. Zoning creates barriers and impediments to housing. Bill was put forth to focus on building. AHC thought it had some good points but the bill didn't have focus on affordable housing. Although the bill died—the discussion has continued. The League of Cities and Towns is crafting a bill to focus more on affordability. AHC is planning to host a day at the Legislature and would encourage folks to come. Employer Sponsored Housing is allowed in rural counties and tribal communities that allows housing on school land for school staff. http://vitalysthealth.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/06/Vitalyst-AttnbleHsng-061421.pdf Legislation would expand to urban areas. Elevating the conversation about the need for services. AHC involved in manufactured housing—ADOH could fund renovation for pre 1976 manufactured housing in addition weatherization -Manufactured Housing—is concerned about how inspections would take place and how application for funds would take place. 	Federal Submission-The Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR) is a HUD report to the U.S. Congress that provides nationwide estimates for homelessness, including information about the demographic characteristics of homeless persons, service use patterns and the capacity to house homeless persons. The report is based on Homeless Management Systems (HMIS) data about persons who experience homelessness during a 12-month period, point-in-time counts of people experiencing homelessness on one day in January, and data about the inventory of shelter and housing available in a community.
	Right now our LSA< PIT/HIC and SPM's are the 3 reports informing the AHAR.
	PIT/HIC week of 2/22. Agency POC's have received an email from the HMIS about the sheltered submission process.
