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Approval of Minutes 4.28.2022	Kelly made a motion to approve, Carlos seconded the motion. The minutes were approved. Allison Torres abstained from voting as she wasn't present at the meeting
7.21.2022 meeting	N/A – meeting on 7.21.2022 was the beginning of the discussion related to the VI-SPDAT in the context of racial equity and social justice. The meeting consisted of presentations by Chris Moeller and Sasha Hawman
Status of CE in each LCEH	Apache/Navajo—meeting every two weeks—working with Re:Center as an access point. Still recruiting PHA, ChangePoint; 10/15 cased conferencing-50 households that are being reviewed for case conferencing.
	Cochise—case conferencing once a month. Good Neighbor Alliance is managing the case conferencing. Santa Cruz is meeting once a month, CPSA is managing case conferencing. About 10 people are being reviewed.
	CoconinoChris—meeting weekly, seeing some seasonally. Working on ensuring Front Door is accessing everyone. Working with jails to do some in-reach. Supplemental assessment seems to be working well and seems to be impacting equity.
	Gila—Allison—meeting every two weeks, CBI is the lead for case conferencing. HOPWA has joined. Gila revised their CO policies—Allison will send to Candee.
	La Paz—no representative present
	Mohave—meeting bi-weekly—have 90-120 on BNL, case conferencing 30 or so- sitting in with Yavapai and Coconino to look at process—also established a supplemental list of questions—bringing on ATLAS system for referrals—will be able to make referrals from four locations Nay indicated by chat Unfortunately, we have not been able to use the HMIS system for referrals. When we refer to other agencies within HMIS the referrals were not making it to the provider we were referring to, So for the past 5 years we have been working off case conferencing and warm handoffs
	Stephanie indicated (by chat) LCEH's can be set up to record the outcomes for non-HMIS providers. Nay responded. Stephanie, Yes the issue was that when dealing with service providers who have multiple programs in Multiple counties there was only one receiver and so all our referrals for our county were going to the one receiver for the other agency and that one person was receiving them for their whole agency and they were getting lost

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	Pinal—completed self-assessment—identifying action items to improve next year—have had to do a clean up on the BNL. Doing case conference once a month—usually discussing 40 persons a month. The clean up included missing first or last names
	Yavapai—case conferencing occurs bi-weekly. CE event—targeting to recruiting to add access points including Prescott Valley and youth. (Anthony Cruz) May need to talk about using the TAY for youth
	Yuma—about 200 on list. Some of the folks are in Crossroads and not ready for housing. Some also don't have VI-SPDAT. CBI can take no-income in their RRH, but WACOG cannot

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	at the data—with HMIS dashboards, we have a foundation of data to review.
	Lived Experience/Equity Feedback:
	Michelle (by chat): In addition to coordination with behavioral health, it would be great to get more input from tribal entities/experts to address the SPDAT equity issue.
	Jocelyn (by chat): It would be great to facilitate a yearly survey of folks and maybe some focus groups and compensating those folks for their time. David indicated that there are some resources available to do that.
	David indicated that he knows these topics can trigger some hard discussions. The purpose of the justice and equity discussion is to identify and address needs—it is not just focused on race but a broader understanding of what is needed by households experiencing homelessness.
	Michelle indicated (by chat): Honestly, the equity question is pretty easy to see when we look at the data, so that may be a tool for getting more buy-in.
	Carlos (by chat)the compensation for their time has been helpful with some of the youth organizations Access points of contact—one of things to do is to brainstorm what other systems of care that we can engage.
	Integration of Services—David indicated that this was somewhat of a focus of the special NOFO. AHCCCS received a waiver to expand the use of AHCCCS funds to include housing and navigation.
	David related that in Washington, the folks with highest acuity were assigned a navigator—Washington saw a significant increase in persons who became housed.
	Michelle (by chat) Oh man, navigators for everyone would be awesome! It's hard to do that for everyone on top of doing CE.
	ID Services—David indicated that the agency in Maricopa is looking to expand statewide. The group pays all the costs for the fees. Carlosindicated that would be great to expand

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	HMIS and Data Tool Needs: David indicated that we need to discuss if there are other tools that need to		
	be added in addition to the dashboards, ensuring accuracy of the by name list. What are the barriers to		
	using the data and are additional tools need to ensure data quality.		
	Jocelyn—(by chat): There is a cool tableau that HMIS put together for Veteran population that I think		
	would help LCEH's understand how well their CE system is working. Jocelyn shared the Veteran		
	dashboard that provides a more detailed look of the individuals/households being served. Cristina indicated that the Veteran dashboard provides a better understanding in the system as a whole. It is

	David asked for feedback about establishing workgroups and meeting in person. He encouraged folks to		
email him or Cristina about any other thoughts or issues. David indicated that ADOH is committee supporting the LCEHs.			
	He indicated that almost 300 individuals and agencies are participating in the AZBOSCOC at the LCEH

HUD Requirement 24 CFR§578.8(a)(8):

In consultation with recipients of Emergency Solutions Grants program funds within the geographic area, establish and operate either a centralized or coordinated assessment system that provides an initial, comprehensive assessment of the needs of individuals and families for housing and services. The Continuum must develop a specific policy to guide the operation of the centralized or coordinated assessment system on how its system will address the needs of individuals and families who are fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, but who are seeking shelter or services from non-victim service providers. This system must comply with any requirements established by HUD by Notice.
