			Ross indicated that in Coconino County referrals with individuals who are survivors are handled through warm referrals between agencies. In some cases, case managers will visit individuals who are at the DV shelter to do initial outreach, but they do not complete a VI-SPDAT. Miguel indicated that there a very few survivors of DV that come into the system because the Yuma Safe House has both shelter and a longer-term (12 month) housing program.
Feedback about information received from cost worksheet—extend deadline to gather more information	Ryan Vernick Candee Stanton	15 minutes	Ryan shared the information that was received from La Paz County LCEH and CCJ in Yavapai County. There was consensus that because of COVID-19, LCEHs had not be able to complete the worksheet within the original time frames. Ryan will send the worksheet out again to the LCEH CE Leads with the due date of September 15th to be returned to Ryan.
Status of Local Policies—Strategies to Encourage local policy development	Ryan Vernick	30 minutes	Ryan facilitated the discussion about the status of LCEH development of local CE/Case Conferencing policies. The LCEH CE policy is a required deliverable that is part of the Planning Contracts the LCEHs have with ADOH. As of this date, four LCEHs have completed the first version of the policy that has been adopted by their LCEH.
			Based on the discussion, there was again consensus that the COVID-19 pandemic has diverted resources away from completing this local policy. There was consensus that this process could be completed by September 15 <sup>th</sup> . The deliverable for that date is a CE policy that reflects local procedures and has been adopted by the LCEH. In order to facilitate the development of the

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			LCEH policies, two options are available. 1) Use Cochise LCEHCE policy as a template and edit it to reflect the CE policies and procedures of your LCEH. Rename the policy with the LCEH name. 2) Use the AZBOSCOC CE policy and add local policies and procedures in each section of the policy in a different color text. Rename the policy with the LCEH name.
