	improve as JAVC gets onboard with HMIS. Hillary explained a lot of the self-identified veterans are never						
	verified and there is no way to contact them to get more information, so they may not qualify as a veteran for

BNL Quality	something that needs to be done AFTER the first step of identifying all veterans experiencing homelessness.						
	This guidance comes from the USICH Criteria and Benchmarks for Achieving the Goal of Ending Veteran						
	Homelessness. An accurate BNL must be accomplished before the data can be refined. Jocelyn suggested						
	identifying which counties HAVE done a good job of identifying all veterans experiencing homelessness, so						
	they can move to the next step instead of being held back by the counties who have not accomplished the first						
	goal.

	 Identify which communities are attending the Veterans Work Group meetings and which counties 						
	are not represented

	This will help move towards:				
	 Identifying all veterans experiencing veteran homelessness within the BoS (Criteria 1 of the USICH guidance on ending veteran homelessness) Then can start to deep dive on the data to create change ideas to move towards ending veteran homelessness 				
	 Specific next steps: Identify who is not attending the bi-monthly meetings. Representation is required from all 13 counties. Jocelyn will contact those counties with no participation and ask for meeting participation. Ryan will pull a list of BNL recipients and provide to Jocelyn. A meeting will be set up in November with these individuals to discuss how to improve the BNL quality. The BFZ quality BNL tool will guide this meeting 				
	Nick and Ryan will meet to identify who in the BoS is not entering data into HMIS. From here, outreach will be conducted to pull organizations into the effort. Nick/Ryan will seek help from Shane in this effort.				
Workgroup/Agency Updates	<u>AZDVS:</u> the Military Family and Relief Fund for Arizona's military families stationed in Arizona with needs related to deployment; Veteran Toolkit to assist with tool purchase for veterans seeking employment				
	 <u>Catholic Charities</u>: <u>ADOH</u>: the two new HUD-funded DV projects are getting underway; a new PSH project was also awarded in Gila County to CBI; no definitive word from HUD regarding if there will be a NOFA or a 2021 PIT count; CCSNF projects are coming to a close, and the shelter supply distribution round two has been completed 				
	 NCHP: year 7 of the SSVF project just closed on September 30th; even with heavy outreach to apartment complexes, homeless prevention activities did not increase much percentage-wise due to COVID-19 CRN: the housing crisis hotline (through 211, which is active 24/7) serves Greenlee, Gila, Graham, and Santa Cruz Counties, so pass the word that this is available; flex-funds are available for security deposits, pet deposits, financial assistance (one time only) for anything that could be preventing a person from
