Approval of the Minutes from the	Terrance moved to approve the minutes of 10/27/20, Maria-Elena seconded the motion. The motion

Discussion Items to be added from	Update on GAB meeting dates—due to last-minute changes the already scheduled upcoming GAB							
Members	meetings will need to be switched from the 3rd Thursday to the 2nd Thursday for the next 6 months; an							
	updated calendar invitation will be sent.							
	There were no additions to the agenda.							
ADOH updates	Ryan provided updates as follows:							
	• Kinari Patel, the ADOH Special Needs Administrator, resigned November 2 nd . The position is							
	posted and interviews are taking place.							
	• The annual Sub-recipient meeting is scheduled for December 9th-							
	• ADOH held a public hearing on 11/19/20 to discuss the CARES Act which was well attended.							
	Arizona received ESG and CDBG. ESG Round 2 allocations will be encumbered by the 1st of the							
	year. 50% of this round –about \$8 million will go to RRH. Betsy indicated with the rise in cases—							
	shelter is still critical. As a result, priorities may shift to meet the need.							
	The three CoCs (Maricopa County/Pima County/AZBOSCOC), DES, AHCCCS, and the HUD TA							
	provider are having discussions related to data collection, data storage, and using data to drive							
	policy decisions. DES was tasked to provide a series of metrics to the Governor's Office around							
	the CARES funding. There was a need to consolidate data from the CoCs- it presented an							
	opportunity to look at this in terms of a statewide database. CRN is looking at Robert Wood							
	Johnson Foundation funds to develop a long-term statewide approach for funds. Letters of							

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	support are needed from the CoCs and the state agencies. The plan is to do a joint letter from ADOH and the AZBOSCOC. The Housing Coalition has agreed to be the applicant for the grant.				
	Denise asked about the purpose of the grant. Ryan indicated that the purpose is to broaden cro sector approaches. Betsy indicated that it is difficult to get a statewide picture –the data warehouse that would be developed would provide a statewide perspective. The deadline for tapplication is December 16 th .				
NOFA update	Ryan indicated that there is no definitive information about the NOFA—it seems it will be either a substantially scaled back NOFA or a normal NOFA. It is anticipated that additional information will be available the 1 st week in December.				
PIT Count Guidance from HUD	 Ryan reviewed the guidance from HUD. Camie asked if the guidance will apply to the entire BOS as a whole, or can the individual communities pick and choose what suits their population the best. Terrance feels that the guidance should be uniform across all of the LCEHs. Jessi agreed. After a lengthy discussion, ideas are: Terrance suggested doing an exception request. Ross suggested doing a complete count. Joanna agreed. Candee suggested taking multiple approaches by doing observational counts and basic surveying of natural gathering places. Data from HMIS/BNL can be used as well. Ryan indicated that Ruby Dhillon-Williams, the ADOH Assistant Deputy Director- Programs had indicated that the Arizona Governor's Office might impose additional expectations. Camie suggested that we wait until we get further guidance to make decisions. Terrance suggested observation only if we have to do something. Jessi indicated that no one should be put at risk. Ricardo suggested we do some minimal planning and suggest only put one person in a car. Ryan summarized that safety is and will be the number one priority in conducting the count both for individuals experiencing homelessness and staff.
