Presentation about potential collaboration with Arizona Housing Coalition related to training activities	 Linda provided an overview of the training discussion. In February 2020, the AZBOSCOC Training Committee convened and had started planning for a presentation at the AHC Conference. Subsequently, with COVID-19 those plans changed. Linda provided an overview of the shift of training to virtual; the sessions which can be provided:		

- Camie asked for clarification about the \$500—Ryan indicated that the \$500 would be paid out of planning funds and would provide for AHC logistics costs.
- Denise suggested that cultural competency and racial equity/social justice be interwoven into trauma informed care.
- Maria-Elena suggested the importance of building foundations related to racial equity and justice.
- Candee mentioned that our ultimate goal for the AZBOSCOC was to develop and provide trainings that filled the gaps that agencies may not be providing to staff.
- Glori asked if the training would be required for all case managers, or are they supplemental. A discussion took place. Ricardo indicated that they have some required trainings for their partners. Camie indicated that agencies do provide many of the trainings—but that these would provide additional opportunities. Glori asked if there any incentive that could be provided—Linda indicated that certificates could be available for individual sessions and also for a set of completed trainings.
- Camie asked what are the next steps? A discussion took place about how to proceed. There was a consensus to distribute a training survey to the LCEHs. A discussion took place about whether trainings will be available as recorded webinars available for a period of time (i.e. a month) for those who couldn't attend "in person." Linda indicated that is a possibility depending on whether the presenters' content/intellectual property could be purchased in addition to what is done while "live." Further discussion took place. Ryan and Linda will have further discussion about the contract logistics and a survey will be distributed on 02/12/21 with a week turnaround.

Presentation from CRN related to LCEH and agency data dashboards

Ryan provided an overview about the agency level dashboards and the County level dashboards. The new website is at hmisaz.org under the reports tab, then scroll down to the bottom and click on the Balance of State button. A variety of reports are available. Glori provided an overview of the data available. Items that are meeting the metric are highlighted in light blue.

Gloria presented the system performance measures.

- First time homelessness is trending down.
- Length of time in shelter is going up slightly
- Successful exit to PH is going up.
- Reduced returns are going down.
- Jobs and income growth is going up (CoC funded only)
- Non-employment growth has limited measurement.

County reports are available for the LCEHs. This information will be transposed quarterly into PowerPoints for LCEH use.

Joanna asked if information is coming from HMIS? Glori indicated yes. Agencies that are

	not entering into HMIS will not be reflected in the data. In terms of domestic violence—		
	not all the domestic violence agencies use the same source. The sheltered PIT counts		
	provides some information to fill the gap for those agencies that do not participate in		
	HMIS.		
	Ryan complemented CRN on the work they have done on this project. Ryan also		
	mentioned that the data will be in real time which will be of great benefit.
