	The 2020 HUD agreements have not been received yet.		
	• The 2021 HUD NOFA—no formal release date has been provided by HUD at this point.		
	ADOH submitted a UFA application for the AZBOSCOC in March; no word yet on the status.		
	2021 Planning contracts have been executed.		
	LCEHs designated representatives for each committee. Committee membership will be updated based on the LCEH designations. If current members are not the designated representative, but you still wish to participate, please contact Ryan. The Listservs for the committees will be updated based on the LCEH profiles.		
	Jocelyn raised the question about how the LCEHs designate individuals to represent the LCEH in the various AZBOSCOC committees. Candee/Ryan clarified that the LCEH profiles provided their designees for the committees. The statewide committees will be reconfigured based on the LCEH profiles.

Users	to clarify the role of the LCEH Lead in managing data quality and the BNL. Ryan indicated that		
	although most lead agencies are HMIS users; in some counties the LCEH Lead will ensure that		
	CE and Case Conferencing is taking place, but there is an identified HMIS and CE Lead who manage the BNL		
	Michelle from Coconino County indicated that they use an MOU to ensure confidentiality among all partners with individuals who are not HMIS users. Michelle indicated that they have a specific MOU with agencies that participate in Case Conferencing but are not HMIS users.

	Marilyn indicated that they are reaching out to additional agencies to participate in Case		
	Conferencing.		
	The consensus among the committee was to establish a policy and process for a requirement that an MOU and Code of Ethics be executed with all non HMIS users who participate in Case Conferencing.		
Update about onboarding bonus DV projects related to Coordinated Entry, Case Conferencing, HMIS,	Ryan provided an overview of the status of onboarding the DV Bonus projects. Cristina indicated that the Pinal policy has been adopted.		
Review CE Addendum	Ryan indicated that the process will continue to evolve as implementation takes place.		
	Michelle asked about how it works with individuals who are DV survivors coming in through		
	other access points. Jocelyn indicated that Case Conferencing for survivors is limited.		
	Michelle indicated that some of the DV agencies in Coconino are concerned about the amount		
	information for survivors. Currently individuals who come through the process, information is		
	limited when first inputted. Ryan indicated that as more DV agencies show interest and become involved, the policies and procedures can evolve and develop.		
Discussion around Homelessness	A number of agencies in the AZBOSCOC are recipients of Homelessness Prevention (ESG) funds.		
Prevention, Outreach, Eviction Prevention and BOS Coordinated	There is language in the CE policy that ESG recipients be required to participate in CE.		
Entry Policy	Glori provided an overview about how individuals enter through an access point. The		
	Homelessness Prevention programs need to participate in a process similar to the CE system.		
	Glori indicated that there is going to be a separate process with a separate assessment.		
	Glori indicated that for HMIS there will be two different processes.		
	For Homelessness Prevention, it will have:		
	 Access points—for Homelessness Prevention the agencies who receive funding can be their own access points. 		
	 Use of the V-7 assessment based on the SSVF homelessness prevention list. 		

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	One question is should there be autonomy so that prevention can move forward without		
	additional steps?		
	The Homelessness Prevention Agency will make sure the client hadn't been served previously so the individual could be served immediately using the assessment.		
	The counties where agencies have been funded included: Coconino, Yavapai, Pinal, Yuma, and Apache.		
	Denise brought up the need for housing for individuals who are coming out of incarceration. She indicated that ideally she would like to see an assessment for these individuals specifically. Glori indicated that she would gather more information.		
	Glori indicated that OrgCode intends to sunset the VI-SPDAT.		
	Outreach through the PATH program is limited in Cochise, Pinal, Mohave, and Coconino.		
	Eviction prevention funds have now been allocated to DES and they are subcontracting with CAP agencies for the services. These funds had been previously managed by ADOH.		
Procedures for review of the CE	The LCEHs are required to do the assessment during the 2021 contract year. We provided		
Assessments and plan to provide	training around the assessment. We will bring results of the assessments to the committee for		
TA as needed	review once all have been completed and submitted-then begin the TA process.
