<b>Approval of the Minutes from the 5.5.2021 meeting</b>	Chris made a motion to approve the notes from the last meeting, Cristina seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously	
<b>LAPP Overview</b>	Linda gave an overview of the LAPP grant, which is exploring the possibility of creating a data warehouse where information can be shared between the three Arizona COCs (Pima, Maricopa, and BOS), AHCCCS, DES, and the HMIS Administrators, with technical assistance from HUD, in order to better track and better serve homeless clients. The AHC received a \$100,000 grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, with a timeline of April 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022.	
<b>Demographics addition to LCEH Dashboards</b>  <b>Data Quality Review – Update</b>	<p>Curtis gave an overview of the new demographics update to the LCEH dashboard. Permanent web hosting is still to be determined and a link will be provided as soon as that is finalized.</p> <p>Each month Solari completes a Performance Report, which includes data quality. For the first time in quite a while, there has been a dip below the “A” range for data quality (data completeness); Ty outlined the correction strategy that is used to bring the quality back up to the highest level.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Homelessness Prevention Status</b></li> <li>• <b>Agreement for non-HMIS users to participate in Case Conferencing</b></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Candee updated the committee; the Coordinated Entry Policy Addendum is being drafted for CE Committee review later this month. The addendum will include the use of the HP assessment currently used by SSVF, which will be implemented in HMIS. The policy will be sent out to the HMIS Committee as well.</li> <li>• Several LCEHs have non-HMIS users participating in Case Conferencing- confidentiality can be an issue; as an example of a way to deal with this, Apache,</li> </ul>	

	<p>Navajo, and Yuma Counties are using the ethics material from the HMIS policy, and those LCEHs are having non-HMIS users sign the document as a commitment to maintain confidentiality. Candee is in the process of converting this stop-gap into an MOU that all parties can sign. The MOU template will be brought before the CE committee in July.</p>
<p><b>Review of current committee initiatives</b></p>	<p>Olivia brought up the question if there are any co-chairs for this committee, and Cristina volunteered. Cristina also brought Olivia and Candee up to date on what the HMIS Committee has been working on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Started tackling the new emergency housing vouchers w/ the PHAs and how the MOUs can be completed in order to use CE</li> <li>• Trying to strengthen and re-energize participation in the BNL, CE, HMIS committee meetings</li> <li>• Talking about DV survivors tied into CE through the 211 system in the areas where there are no public access points (Graham, Greenlee, and Santa Cruz counties)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Discussion about plan to complete review and update of HMIS policies</b></p>	<p>The HMIS policies (Security Plan, Data Quality Plan, and Privacy Plan) are required to be reviewed each year; historically a separate meeting is conducted for each plan for an in-depth yearly review, with a subsequent meeting to approve all three at the same time. Solari proposes to present the changes they feel are necessary, and then the group can discuss and finalize the policies. Ty agreed to have the proposed changes presented at an August meeting for discussion, with approval after the NOFA has been released so fine-tuning can be conducted based on what is required.</p>
