LAPP Data Warehouse Update	Linda gave an overview of the LAPP grant, which is exploring the possibility of creating a data						
	warehouse where information can be shared between the three Arizona COCs (Pima, Maricopa, and						
	BOS), AHCCCS, DES, and the HMIS Administrators, with technical assistance from HUD, in order to						
	better track and better serve homeless clients. The AHC received a \$100,000 grant from the Robert Wood						
	Johnson Foundation, with a timeline of April 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022.						
	The Governance Charter mandates that each CoC will have three members as well as DES and AHCCCS						
	(each agency will have one representative). One of the representatives from each of the CoCs will have						
	lived experience (a stipend will be available).						
	Maria-Elena asked if there needed to be a board member and whether there is going DV representation.						
	Denise commented that she would like to see a focus on tribal and criminal justice involvement. Linda indicated that both of the issues have had initial discussions.						
	Ricardo is attending the LAPP meetings as a non-voting member. ADHS is looking to join the initiative as well.						
	Terrance volunteered as a member with lived experience; Denise also volunteered and also has lived experience. Cristina Benitez—had volunteered at the HMIS Committee earlier this week.						
	Focus groups will be completed for community engagement; Denise suggested a tribal focus group.

Presentation by Joanna on Funding Availability	Olivia—GAB Member and the Special Needs Administrator  Joanna provided an overview of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds that are available in the AZBOSCOC. 	The Coalition has been supporting the development of affordable housing throughout the state and support services to promote housing stability. There are opportunities to braid funds with other resources.

	Silvia mentioned that an allocation has also been given to LEAs with funds to address youth homelessness. A priority is to provide wrap-around services for students and their families. Approximately \$3M will be distributed immediately. In December, an additional \$12M will be released. The usual allocation is \$2M. Funds needs be spent by 2024.				
Brief Overview of AHCCCS	Cristina and Denise provided an overview of the AHCCCS Waiver request.				
Waiver Request	Arizona is seeking waiver and expenditure authority to improve health care delivery and health outcomes for AHCCCS members who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless using strategies designed to fill identified gaps, expand existing evidence-based practices, and reduce barriers to housing.				
	Denise asked for subpopulations, such as people exiting incarceration, is there flexibility where they don't have to be enrolled in the behavioral health system as long as they have AHCCCS? The answer is yes.
