<p>System Performance Measures and Demographics</p>	<p>Curtis provided an overview of the demographics dashboard and the System Performance Measures dashboard.</p> <p>Dashboard* see link below Solari—has developed the dashboard. They notified us at the HMIS meeting that they are finalizing the link—so it will be different than the one provided below—we will update the link when it is sent to us.</p>
<p>LAPP Overview</p>	<p>Olivia provided an overview of the LAPP initiative which is developing strategies to develop a data warehouse across the three CoCs. Each of the three continuums have three representatives to the LAPP Governance Group. The AZBOSCOC’s representatives include Olivia Gutzman, Terrance Walker—an AZBOSCOC Governance Advisory Board Member and the CPSA Housing Director, and Chris Moeller—the CCS HMIS administrator and member of the AZBOSCOC HMIS Committee.</p>

System Performance Measures HUD cumulative document between 2015-2020	Candee provided a brief overview of the HUD document that includes five years of System Performance Measures. This is a tool that is a companion to the dashboards that Curtis discussed. Information will be useful as LCEHs review SPM to see how local systems can be enhanced.
Sylvia Chavez Presentation about funds available through the Department of Education	<p>ADE is getting approximately \$4M which will go to the LEAs. Phase 2 is \$12 which will come out in September. Funds are focused on families and their children who are experiencing homelessness. The definition of homelessness is different for McKinney-Vento funds but still provides opportunity across all families experiencing homelessness. Silvia will provide us a list of the homeless liaisons that we will distribute to you, and we will provide her contact information for all the LCEH leads.</p> <p>The list of liaisons is attached to this email. Please reach out to your school districts and engage with the Homeless Liaisons if they are not already a part of your LCEH.—The funds available could be very helpful as leveraged resources with other service activities. We have also asked Silvia to ask the liaisons to reach out to the LCEHs.</p>
Funding Options—from Presentation Joanna Carr provided to the GAB	<p>Candee provided a brief overview of the funding available throughout the AZBOSCOC through the SLFRF funds. Progress <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PHA/EHV MOU Development • Social Justice/Racial Equity Initiative 	<p>Maria Porter—indicated that they are working with Santa Cruz to establish case conferencing in Santa Cruz. They are working on moving on procedures. They are in the process of developing protocols for case conferencing related to the PHA/EHV</p> <p>Heather Patel—indicated that Pinal County has been executed and will be sent to Olivia for the AZBOSCOC signatures. Malissa indicated that the Gila County’s will go to the Board of Supervisors on the 28th. Yuma is working on theirs. Navajo is working on theirs.</p> <p>LCEHs indicated that they are working on the Social Justice/Racial Equity Initiative. Some have the presentation of the GAB Workgroup scheduled in upcoming weeks.</p>

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<p>Homelessness Prevention Implementation A draft of an addendum to the Coordinated Entry Policy will be discussed with the committee next week. In the meantime—how is homelessness prevention being managed in Case Conferencing—Any information provided will help inform the draft policy.</p>	<p>Homelessness prevention resources continue to be challenge due to the eviction moratorium—but it is anticipated that the funds will be needed once the moratorium ends. Candee indicated that a Coordinated Entry Policy Addendum related to Homelessness Prevention is being developed for review by the CE Committee at its meeting later in the month.</p>
<p>Other updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Non HMIS Users Agreement—related to case conferencing • LCEH updates 	<p>Several LCEH Leads expressed interest in the Non-HMIS Users Agreement—which will also be reviewed by the CE Committee at its meeting later this month.</p> <p>Nay indicated that Mohave is going live with its EHV's on Monday. Heather indicated that Pinal will be hiring a staff person related to the EHV program</p>
