	<p>currently using the workflow that populates the coordinated entry measure.</p> <p>Maria-Elena asked for confirmation that survivors of domestic violence are not included in the data on the dashboards. She also pointed out that the White designation does not include Hispanic ethnicity, which is a separate category.</p> <p>Stephanie indicated that she would share the links to the dashboards to Melissa for distribution—they are also provided below.</p>
Special Needs Team Introduction	<p>Olivia, Melissa, Shannon, Connie, Candee, and Cristina introduced themselves and provided some background information about themselves.</p>
NOFO, PIT Count, and UFA Update	<p>Cristina provided a PIT count update; the PIT will run January 25th through February 1st, with the unsheltered PIT date being January 25th. The Unsheltered PIT Workgroup met last week—a sub-workgroup will be meeting next week to review and finalize the survey. Incentive funds will be provided to supplement local efforts.</p> <p>Olivia provided a NOFO update: it was submitted on time—thank you for your support and effort related to the application.</p> <p>UFA—the Arizona Department of Housing was designated as a UFA for the AZBOSCOC. The UFA provides the ability to reallocate funds as needed.</p> <p>Camie and Terrance asked about the possibility of realignment of funds to provide supportive services.</p> <p>Olivia indicated that she would follow up with the UFA group to get input from other UFAs how realignment might take place.</p>
Contract Monitoring HMIS Licenses	<p>Cristina indicated that there has been several requests for licenses. Cristina audited all the licenses to make sure all were in use. The process has been updated so that all license requests now go to Cristina. Stephanie concurred that Solari also audits license use to make sure all the licenses are active.</p> <p>Cristina indicated that invoices for licenses for 2022 will go out in December.</p> <p>Olivia shared that the remote/virtual contract monitoring will continue to occur in 2022; it will continue to be a three-day process.</p>

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Recipient Listening Sessions Upcoming Trainings	<p>Olivia indicated that staff are going to do listening sessions with each sub-recipient to discuss about housing availability. Olivia asked that the sub-recipient include case manager and others. Sub-Recipient Accomplishments	<p>Achieve—indicated that they have a good year in transitioning residents from subsidy to self-sufficiency.</p> <p>KAAP—the CoC DV program has been very successful.</p> <p>OCCAC—LCEH has been established and case conferencing is taking place. Winslow PHA has been active and EHV's are being used.</p> <p>Against Abuse—have built the infrastructure related to the CoC funds—Maria-Elena became chair of the Pinal County LCEH and they have implemented Coordinated Entry related to special populations</p> <p>US Vets—Established a day center and a medical center on the campus; opening a property in Prescott Valley after a five-plex was donated; the Fort Whipple project moving forward. Carole became a board member of the Housing Coalition.</p> <p>CCCS—Serving five counties; using RRH and PSH units; received additional funding from other sources; opened the shelter in Bullhead City, which includes family and veterans' wings.</p> <p>CBI— Started PSH in Gila County; case conferencing is fully functioning with a BNL; also got RRH funding from DES as well in Gila County; still struggling with reaching out to landlords</p> <p>CPSA—expended all Homeless Prevention Funds; covering six counties for RRH and Emergency Shelter; helping to build LCEHs in Santa Cruz, Cochise and Graham/Greenlee Counties; expanding employment services and support; two full-time SOAR specialists.</p>
