Review and approval of meeting notes from June 4, 2024	Terrance Watkins	5	Terrance asked if there were any comments. Clayton made a motion to approve, Ross seconded. The meeting notes were approved.				
 Data Quality and Update The existing policy The current DQ status/score Brief description of HMIS team's work to support agencies related to compliance. 	Randy Hade, Solari Sam, Debuse, Solari	15	David introduced Randy and Sam. Randy provided an overview of the importance of the data quality which impacts information about the system performance measures. 7 days is the time frame for entry of information into HMIS Completeness—Universal data elements –95% complete is the standard. For program data elements it fluctuates. Data quality is good for the vast majority of projects. 56% of the projects are 95%+. Shelters generally have lower data quality—The Solari HMIS team is				

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			working with the agencies to help them clean their data and move towards 95%. The team is also going to start sending alerts when data quality is 95%. If there are policies or compliance issues, they will be taken to the HMIS Committee for review. Kelly asked if the data quality chart was only CoC projects . Randy indicated that it is all the projects in HMIS. David indicated that the data is critical in making individual decisions and process decisions to end homelessness.				
			Randy indicated that Solari will be producing a document related to available reports shortly. He then provided some data quality tips. Solari is planning to do a biannual data clean-up. Currently it only happens once a year.				
			David indicated that the three CoCs have agreed to look at a new HMIS platform. The plan is to RFP . Solari has provided funds through the Garcia Foundation to hire a consultant to manage that RFP. The three CoCs are also discussing a joint governance structure. Setting up the workgroup is imminent.				
			AZHAC has the AZBOSCOC data. They have subsequently asked for a monthly upload. AZHAC is looking at evictions, 211, benefits information from DES. The Governance Advisory Board didn't express any issues of sharing information monthly.				
Operationalizing Strategi Action Plan Establish benchmarks for plan Establish benchmarks related to System Performance Measures	David	20	David provided an overview of the Strategic Action Plan that was approved by the Governance Advisory Board in June.				
Discussion about Board members would like to be involved in process			David provided an overview of the SPMs and some benchmarks. Length of Time Homeless—through data quality clean up—the mean has been reduced. The national average is 100-150—we are below that, but HUD did set a national goal should be 20 days or reduce average by 10 from one year to the next. There are variety of interventions to impact and reduce the length of stay. Median Length of Time would be 22 days and reduce ES/TH average length of time by 10% from one year to the next. Kelly Tanner indicated that 70 days is lofty considering the current housing market. David indicated that the benchmark would be to maintain the 77 days.				
			David provided information about SPM 2 Returns to Homelessness—80% of population is not coming back through the system in two years. High Performing Communities set the benchmark at 5%or 20% year to year reduction.				
			David indicated that the AZBOSCOC is doing well related to PSH retention.				

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			David provided an overview of the rest of SPM data and potential benchmarks. He indicated that the data will be sent out for further review. The idea of setting benchmarks is not to be punitive but rather to target interventions to improve the ability to end homelessness.				
			Kelly asked about how did HUD establish the benchmarks for High Performing Community. David indicated that they were established years ago and there are HUD resource documents around each of the strategies.				
			Monica asked about local perspectives and how local data is collected. Monica agreed that a Data Analytics Workgroup is a good idea. David indicated that looking at data by demographics and subpopulation will be included.				
LCEH update	Cristina David	15	Item was not covered due to time constraints.				
CoC Builds NOFO	David	10	David provided an overview of the CoC Builds—AZBOSCOC has the potential of \$5 million for a single project—it estimated that new construction would result in 10-12 units. He indicated that there are 400+ CoCs but only 25 projects will be funded. The partner is critical. For full points must demonstrate 50% leverage from health and/or housing partners. David has had initial discussions with AHCCCS. They are willing to partner. David indicated that two project can be submitted if one of the projects is in a tribal community. Clayton indicated that he has some contacts. Monica indicated that Gila River Indian Community might be interested-she would like to see the NOFO. David explained that there will be a process for a request for a Letter of Interest that will be distributed through the ADOH Bulletin and the AZBOSCOC stakeholders. David asked that members distribute as they can. Ross asked if there were ways to make the AZBOSCOC more competitive through action now. She also encouraged that the AZBOSCOC try to do the two projects in order to partner with a tribal community.
