		Kyle from Good Neighbor Alliance—there are challenges with folks populating on the by name list. Cristina will follow up with Solari to see if they can troubleshoot. Joceyln indicated that Pinal County list was glitchy last week. As an aside David indicated that there are some visibility issues that are being worked on. A meeting will be set up.
		Some thoughts for the LCEH CE policy revisions—how ROI is updated, responsibility of the agency to make the connection for the warm hand-off from the current agency to the receiving agency. Connections with the DV shelters are critical—and would be a good option for doing the VISPDAT if that needs to be done.
		Lauryn from the AZ Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence (ACESDV) indicated that they can help with developing local procedures and provide some training. Services are offered to survivors including those participating in housing. David indicated that not all LCEHs have local DV shelters and services so it may be another agency.
		David mentioned that HUD included a VAWA line item in renewal projects and for the bonus projects. Funds are moved into the VAWA from another line item in the budget for renewal projects
		Bernadette indicated that CBI has had some challenges about staff turnover and maintaining connections locally so important to communicate on a regular basis. Bernadette indicated that they were able to put a project through Shelter Point into HMIS to broaden visibility about the availability to receive referrals. Hannah indicated that finding vouchers is challenging
		David indicated that the 2024 HUD NOFO is imminent. Information will be released about how to apply for bonus project funds that will be available.
