Review and approval of meeting notes from 10/6/24.*  * Note—the other dates that were discussed were notes from LCEH meetings which will be considered by the LCEH Committee on 12/9.	Terrance Watkins	5 minutes	JoAngel Villabos-(ADOH)  Terrance introduced the need to approved notes/minutes from the 10/6/24  Governance Advisory Board meeting. Kelly W. made a motion to approve, and Monica A. seconded the motion. The notes/minutes were approved
CoC Builds Application update	David Bridge	15 minutes	David provided an overview of NOFO Builds. Initially six applications were received. Three applications were reviewed for consideration with Kingman Regional Medical Center being the application that was submitted at the end of November. The project is for 17 units that will be constructed on land already owned by KRMC. As required, the units will be permanent supportive housing, for households meeting the definition of chronically homeless. HUD will only fund 25 projects—with anticipation that the project would start in October 2025.

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			David indicated that several of the applicants were new potential partners and present future opportunities for some projects.
Review of Subrecipient Expenditure Tracking Process	David Bridge		David provided an overview. Last year approximately \$450,000 was left on the table with half of the funds being related to the DV providers. Individual meetings are taking place with each subrecipient to assess current expenditure status and any concerns.  David indicated that if it appears that funds are going to be left on the table—David will provide an update to Board and if appropriate provide some options about how funds can be reallocated to other subrecipients or establish new projects.  Terrance indicated that he has a potential for DV projects if an application process
			occurs.
System Performance Measure Update	David Bridge		David shared an example of a flow process about # SPM Reduce returns/recidivism. David discussed strategies related to addressing homelessness prior to it occurring and then secondly to address returns to homelessness and recidivism which also reduces in-flow. He provided information about how all the of the SPM are tied together and how services are key to making the system work and ultimately reducing homelessness.
			David proposed that SPM status be shared each month and provided some specific data related to each SPM as examples. David asked for feedback about how the information should be presented. Kate indicated that she liked the visualization but is open to a different format.
			Monica indicated that she liked the information. She asked if demographics could be incorporated as an additional way to look at the information to address the need for resources. She discussed the interaction between the SPMs and some of the issues she is seeing related to the sober living challenge and 211 project. David indicated that he will contact Solari about the 211 data and see if there are intersections. She also indicated that she recently went to Hopi and their need for connections for DV resources within the tribal community as well as nearby communities.
			David indicated that as an aside—he provided information about the three CoCs working together to develop a statewide an emergency transfer plan and related procedures to support the safety of households that are survivors of DV.
			Kate M asked if there was a way to identify the causes of homelessness. David indicated that he would look at the data and see what is available related to coming through institutional settings and other causes. Kate also asked if there was additional information about exits. David indicated that information is provided to AHCCCS but right now no information comes back because of HIPPPA. David indicated that he would talk with AHCCCS and see if there is additional information that can be shared.

			Cristina indicated that the goal is to continue to be a diverse group and include key stakeholders related to ending homelessness.
