AHCCCS is also sharing information with the Managed Care Organizations. The MCOs have an obligation to reach out to individuals within two weeks. The second request is for the Solari H2O Team to see the BOS By Name List. If they have the By Name List they can match directly and conduct outreach The overall goal is to get individuals/households connected to care and services. H20 team will provide share outs back to the AZBOSCOC. Monical asked what MCO stands for —David indicated they are the service networks such as Mercy Care BCBS, Centine, etc. Monica asked about TRBHA coordination —David indicated that the same protocols will also apply to the four TRBHAs. If the tribe does not have a TRBHA, then the tribes interact with the American Indian Health Plan — that plan may cover both individuals with a serious mental illness or general mental health. Indian Health Services is a separated entity. Kate confirmed that information is shared with the TRBHA or AHIC plan as appropriate. Protocols are the same. Monica indicated that tribal members are being encouraged to participate in the MCOs rather than the Indian Health Services. David indicated that initially the vast majority of individuals were in Maricopa County and then Pima County and ther Flagstaff. Solari is building the relationships with providers based on where the individuals reside. TRBHA/RBHAS are focused on individuals that have a serious mental illness and may have other designations as well. Kate indicated that currently H2O is only focused on individuals with a serious mental illness. Renewal of AHCCCS agreement—motion was made by Kelly Tanner and seconded by Jena Pannas.
