To End Homelessness

- Homelessness is prevented when possible
- If prevention is not possible: Homelessness is rare, brief and one time

Where do we start?

We first looked at federal benchmarks to end homelessness produced by the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH)

- Identify and engage ALL people experiencing homelessness as quickly as possible.
- The community has identified all veterans experiencing homelessness.
- The community has identified and provided outreach to all individuals experiencing or at risk for chronic homelessness, and prevents chronic homelessness whenever possible.
- The community identifies all unaccompanied youth experiencing homelessness.
- The community identifies all families experiencing homelessness.



What is the BNL?

- A list of all known individuals experiencing homelessness with supplemental information to prioritize and streamline services
- Useful for practitioners
- More than a report







What the BNL is not

- The end; it is just the identification of who needs support
- JUST a number
- Going to do the rest of the work for you

What is included in the BNL?



It will differ for each community

Some key points that are included:

- Identifying information (Name, DOB, Gender, Client ID #)
- Prioritization information (Assessment scores, length of time homeless, chronic homeless status)
- Support information (Where they stayed last, case conferencing notes, Veteran status)
- And more

This can be adjusted based on what will be most useful to each community



- Coordinate outreach coverage
- Maximize provider participation
- List ALL known individuals
- Implement policies on active versus inactive
- Timely/Accurate data updates

- Track status changes
- Assign unique identifiers
- Track Inflow/Outflow
- Track population status
- Track chronic status

How is the BNL Distributed?

Balance of State:

- Sent to one point of contact for each community
- List is projected on a screen or physical copies are shared during the meeting
- Established a privacy policy specifically for the BNL and Case Conferencing.

Maricopa:

- Sent via encryption to distribution list held by the Coordinated Entry Lead.
- All recipients must sign ethics agreement, privacy notice, and attestation.
