Everyone was welcomed, and the meeting started at 10:08 a.m. Introductions were made, and the minutes to the last meeting were unanimously approved after a motion was made by Terrance and seconded by Carole.

Ryan went over highlights of the HEARTH Act <a href="https://www.hudexchange.info/homelessness-assistance/hearth-act/">https://www.hudexchange.info/homelessness-assistance/hearth-act/</a>. Any questions should be directed to ADOH.

### **LCEH Responsibilities and Membership**

All LCEH's are in contract with ADOH for planning around your local coalitions. The BOSCOC receives about 116 thousand in planning dollars and tries to share that with the LCEH's. However, Requests for Payment to ADOH for planning grant activities is very slow or non-existent. Ryan

discussed aspects of the SOW for planning contracts and the requirements, including upcoming deadlines.

Yuma County is struggling to bring key partners/stakeholders to the table for coordination.

Action Item: Karia will email WACOG to ask them about increasing their participation.

Candee handed out a synopsis of the Strategic Action Plans that have been received so far with high-level ideas on which different LCEH's are working.

Everyone is encouraged to read the NOFA to gain insight on the information HUD requires. For example, under Gaps Analysis, HUD wants a *number* to identify units needed that are not being covered already, instead of a narrative of what gaps there are overall. Let ADOH know if you have a partner at a college/university who could help develop an algorithm to statistically apply the data points to figure out a formula that anyone can use to find the gap number for their program(s).

Carole suggested taking the number of available units and estimate how many people will be served by those units, subtract this number from the BNL, then take the remaining number and multiply it by the previous year's percentage of first-time homeless in order to get a concrete number to call the gap in ending homelessness.

It appears HUD is trending towards official collaboration/memorandums of understandings with workforce boards as well as DV training, so these are clues that more emphasis may be placed on these areas in the next NOFA.
