A co-chair is sought for the HMIS committee. ADOH undertook a HUD audit- there are several findings/issues that will be addressed in the coming months.	
 HMIS data input and accuracy Functionality for CE leads send housing referrals from CE/CC meeting to COC Housing Providers Reviewing entries for completeness Accuracy of housing status upon entering/exit in a COC housing project 	ADOH is working on training topics. Stephanie reviewed the Data Quality Report; the goal is to be around 97% accuracy, but the current average is around 93%. Stephanie explained the distinction of Data Quality vs. Data Completeness and showed how to navigate the system to find the different reports through the new format.

David gave an update on data sharing with AHCCCS and the other two Arizona	
CoCs through the LAPP grant- subcommittees are looking at how to use the data,	
what vendor to use, legal issues to maintain confidentiality, etc.	
Gila County- there is a rise in homelessness, mainly due to a fire at a long-term-stay hotel in conjunction with overall lack of housing, so the county is trying to get around 20 people housed	
Yavapai County- it's a challenge geographically since a major mountain splits the county; implemented an EHV voucher system implemented	
Yuma County- Case Conferencing is continuing every two weeks to get referrals to housing	
Mohave County- starting to see housing stock open up a little bit; more property management companies are coming on board; Section 8 was opened up in Colorado City; making changes to the CE process	
Cochise County- always seeking landlords	
Pinal County- HMIS committee is regularly meeting; ESG-funded program has had	
some recent success; there is a small landlord incentive program to get more landlords willing to rent; HOME-ARP funding is also being used	
Coconino County- one of the big pushes is to recognize one of the major inflows is	
the criminal justice system, so efforts are being focused on getting CE personnel	
into the jails prior to release to work on obtaining housing before people are	
released and on the streets with nowhere to go; racial equity is just starting to	
even out
