	• There was discussion about the potential for adding representation from ABC/Home Inc. It was decided that should continue to					
	be explored but since those agencies of direct contractual relationships with AHCCCS, that AHCCCS might decide to draw from					
	those agencies to be the AHCCCS represented on the Governance Advisory Board.					
	• There was a discussion about Veterans—the consensus was with ADOH staff attending the Veteran Committee—the connection					
	exists, and collaboration can take place through that connection as well as the representatives at the LCEH level.					
	• A brief discussion took place about establishing a technical assistance expert group that could support the AZBOSCOC with					
	content expertise. A pilot of that process will be to invite the RBHAs and the Veteran representatives to future LCEH meetings.					
	There was also some discussion about ABC/Home Inc. being invited to future Subrecipient meetings.					
	A motion made by Karen and seconded by Camie to have the following as permanent agency representatives: ACDSV Coalition,					
	AZ Housing Coalition, AZ Department of Education, AZ Department of Economic Security, AHCCCS, and ADOH. The other seven					
	members will be a mixture of sub-recipients, persons with lived experience, tribal community representation and other community					
	members who are interested in ending homelessness in the AZBOSCOC. The motion was approved.					
	Based on Board action, Governance Charter will be updated and sent out in the next few weeks for any additional feedback.					
	Cristina indicated that she is working on 11 planning contracts and 8 of the capacity building contracts for the LCEH Lead agencies.					
-	She indicated that they should be finalized shortly. David indicated that the-funds-are being used for a variety of activities include					
-	navigation, coordinated entry, meeting facilitation and other activities that fully support the local proves. He indicated that the					
	LCEH Lead Agencies presented creative approaches to expanding local continuums of service and that these new expanded					

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	contracts will have a positive impact on ending homelessness in the AZBOSCOC.					
	David indicated that Terrance has been working with Graham County representatives and that there is an initial meeting scheduled February 22 nd as a kick-off for the LCEH. David and Cristina will be attending and David asked if there are other individuals who should be invited. CPIH/CPSA will be the LCEH Lead Agency for Graham and there is hope that Greenlee County will also participate.					
	David provided information about the Special NOFO. He indicated that the AZBOSCOC got two projects funded related to the rural funding, a project in Gila and a project to serve Navajo/Apache. On the unsheltered side, the majority of those funds went to urban CoCs. Only 30 of the 50 states received funds under the Special NOFO.					
	David indicated that HUD said the regular NOFO announcement is imminent.					
	Candee indicated that unsheltered PIT surveys are starting to come in and that there has been several calls from shelters not in HMIS—she will be following up with those agencies in the next week.
