 Letters from LCEH persons with lived experience committees. PHA relationships- status Volunteers to review bonus project 		projects. Candee provided a brief overview of the 2023 LCEH RFI. She indicated that it will be similar to last year and that the LCEHs will be provided a couple of weeks to complete. Development is pending additional documents being released by HUD. The other two major areas for LCEH involvement includes –documentation of persons with lived experience that are contributing to planning and program development. Ideas were discussed including using peer programs such as HOPE, Inc. as a documentation source. Candee indicated that she will review the requirements and develop a template that LCEHs can adopt to their specific situation. Candee also indicated that PHA involvement and their policies related to prioritizing persons experiencing homelessness is an important collaboration. There was discussion about how that could be documented. Candee will provide additional information in the LCEH RFI about what is needed related to the PHAs. Candee asked the LCEH Leads to reach out to their members and stakeholders and see if anyone is interested in being a part of the workgroups to review bonus projects.  Status Updates Referral Reporting HMIS Health Care information HMIS Status of data sharing agreements- AHCCCS and research project BNL clean up 	David and Cristina	 Cristina indicated that MOUs are needed for case conferencing related to referrals. The MOUU is in draft form and will be sent out to the LCEH Leads for review. Once this is completed it will brought to the committees (CE & HMIS) and approval by the GAB. Solari is going to start in-person training which will start in Mohave the first week in August. The four Southern counties will be next for HMIS basic training. The HMIS Committee is reviewing policies which will also be aligned to Coordinated Entry policies Specific items that will be addressed include time to referral acceptance, how many referrals can be accepted/denied by the project to which the referral was made David indicated that the data sharing agreement with AHCCCS is moving forward. AHCCCS will be able to provide aggregate data but not patient data because of HIPAA.

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			David indicated in future months, that AHCCCS will be able to pay for some activities related to housing including items such as transitional shelter for persons moving out institutional settings, some move in costs and other items that contribute to people being housed.	
			The HMIS Committee is reviewing the potential of opening up the questions in HMIS related to health care. David suggested that the LCEHs look into the Community Health Workers and Community Health Representative https://www.azahcccs.gov/CHW and Arizona Community Health Workers Association-https://azchow.org/	ves-
			David also indicated that there is another data sharing project with the three universities. They are doing researc on areas such as individuals with high costs and high needs, recidivism and other areas that the Arizona CoCs identify.	ch
			David and Cristina indicated that Solari is working on the BNL clean-up, but that LCEHs should also do a review with particular focus on households that have been on the BNL for long periods of time –to assess where that information is accurate or is something that needs additional information in HMIS to reflect more accurate status.	
			Cristina indicated that the AZBOSCOC will have access to Tucson's CoC Learning Management system to access range of training topics such as CoC 101, Trauma Informed Care, and other topics. AZBOSCOC specific content valso be added. There is also a plan to collaborate with U of A so certification can be provided for some training activities.	
			David/Cristina, that approximately 30 to 40 persons from the AZBOSCOC area will be attending the Housing For in August. Focused activities for the AZBOSCOC include breakfast on the 28 th with developers including use of rural incentives related to LIHTC applications. For the last round of applications, there was a record number of applications from the AZBOSCOC geographic area.	um
