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Action Item: Motion and Approval for the Arizona Department of Housing to submit the Collaborative Application and related documents on behalf of the AZBOSCOC	David and Members	David provided a brief overview, that formal approval is required by the Governance Advisory Board related to the submittal of the AZBOSCOC Collaborative application in response to the 2023 HUD CoC NOFO. With that, Terrance made a motion that the AZBOSCOC Governance Advisory Board formally approve, The Arizona Department of Housing as United Funding Agency and Collaborative Applicant For the AZ Balance of State Continuum of Care (AZBOSCOC) to submit the AZBOSCOC Collaborative Application in response to the 2023 HUD CoC NOFO. Maria Elena seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.					
Review renewal and bonus project rankings. Motion and Approval of the final ranking and Tier 1 and Tier 2 Projects	David and Members	 David provide an overview about the HUD NOFO requirements related to scoring and ranking renewal and bonus projects. The activities outlined included: In early spring the subrecipients meet to review the scoring matrix for the renewal projects. The matrix includes scoring attributes taken from the APR or comparable report (for the renewal DV Bonsu projects). The scoring attributes align to the System Performance Measures. Other sources of data that is included in the scoring matrix are attributes from monitoring conducted by ADOH Housing Specialists, data quality data from the HMIS Systems Administrator, and subrecipient self-scored items. The subrecipients met several times to review alignment of the scoring attributes with HUD requirements and to ensure they were weighted fairly and appropriately. When the NOFO opened, a workgroup of Governance Advisory Members met and developed the scoring matrix for the bonus project application as well as the bonus application questions. A single application is developed for use for both regular and DV Bonus applications. The subrecipients convene to review project scoring and develop a proposed ranking for consideration by the Governance Advisory Board. In addition, to the project scoring, as a BOS CoC, there are other considerations including geographic coverage and meeting communities related to project type. As a result, the subrecipient proposed final ranking of the renewal projects (for Governance Advisory Board consideration) resulted in two higher scoring projects being placed in Tier 2 to maintain the integrity of a PSH project that covers 4 rural communities. The AZBOSCOC received two regular bonus project applications and no DV Bonus project applications. David indicated that extensive outreach occurred to DV agencies both through the AZ Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence (ACESDV) and the AZBOSCOC Local Coalitions/Continuums to End Homelessness. For the two bonus projects, one is for RRH in Pinal C					
Other Items	Members	David provided a brief update on the RFI that ADOH issued to solicit input about upcoming request for proposals related to Housing Trust Funds. David indicated that more than 80 RFIs were received, many from individuals and agencies from the BOS geographic area. In follow up at the Homeless to Housing Roundtable, which takes place every other week on Friday, Joan Serviss –ADOH Director indicated that as of mid-August for the RFIs received the three areas identified were affordable housing, shelter development, and transitional housing.
