	A recent evaluation of the 3 CoC's found that the providers are doing their jobs well, we can continue to improve education and training, but the biggest negative is the HMIS vendor, Wellsky. The recommendation is to do an evaluation to see if the CoC's want to move away from Wellsky as the HMIS vendor, possibly one that can incorporate different software used by Veterans or DV providers so data entry doesn't have to be done in multiple places. The GAB has approved moving forward with research of vendors.
