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**Arizona Department of Housing
2016 Unsheltered and Sheltered Count
Balance of State Continuum of Care**

INTRODUCTION:

The following is the 2016 Point In Time Report. The Arizona Balance of State Continuum of Care (AZBOSCOC) has worked in partnership with local government, non-profits, faith communities and volunteers to conduct the Point In Time Survey (PIT). The annual PIT survey efforts involve hundreds of volunteers working countless hours during the week of the survey to capture the need on a single night of the year. Every year, the PIT efforts are dependent upon the local leadership, volunteer recruitment and turnout, weather and the participation of those experiencing homelessness. We thank you.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- The number of households and persons in Emergency Shelter have decreased since 2014.
- There was a 52.8% decrease of unsheltered veterans in 2016.
- There was a reduction by 6.7% of those unsheltered from 2015.

OVERVIEW: The Arizona Department of Housing (ADOH) is the Collaborative Applicant for Balance of State Continuum of Care (BOSCOC). The U.S. Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD) requires that communities that provide services to persons who are experiencing homelessness and receive HUD funding for housing projects must convene a continuum of care. The BOSCOC has many responsibilities including:

- **Planning and implementing** services for persons who are experiencing homelessness in thirteen counties in Arizona including Apache, Cochise, Coconino, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, La Paz, Mohave, Navajo, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai and Yuma.
- Through the Arizona Department of Housing as fiscal agent, the BOSCOC **makes permanent supportive housing, transitional housing and rapid re-housing services available** to persons who are experiencing homelessness in the counties identified above.
- **The Yearly Sheltered Count** – As required by HUD, the number of persons who are in emergency shelter, transitional housing and permanent housing must be counted in a single point of time count that takes place annually during the last week in January. In 2016, this count occurred on January 26th.

This count includes all agencies that enter data in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). Some agencies, such as domestic violence programs and PHA's that administer VASH do not participate in HMIS. In those cases, ADOH requests information for the count from those individual agencies. Although HUD considers only those in emergency shelter and transitional housing as "homeless" for the purposes of the count, those in permanent housing are also counted to give an overall picture of persons housed by homeless service providers.

The Yearly Unsheltered Count – In addition to the sheltered count, HUD also requires continuums of care to count persons who are unsheltered as a part of the point in time count. ADOH provides coordination for this effort statewide, but local coordinators and volunteers in communities throughout the BOSCOC complete the count.

The following provides a summary of information collected in 2016 along with a complete data report by county.

Overview of Persons and Households Count 2013-2016

The BOSCOG has been conducting point in time counts since 2008. Originally unsheltered counts were completed every other year and sheltered counts every year. In 2015 the BOSCOG made the commitment to conduct unsheltered counts every year. This decision aligned the BOSCOG with HUD's increasing use of data related to program and funding decisions. Completing the unsheltered count every year provides the BOSCOG with timely information for decision making and improves the ability to be competitive in the HUD Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) process.

Several items impact the count:

- The quality of the information inputted into HMIS.
- The survey and methodology for the unsheltered count is improved upon yearly.
- Local Coordinators have helped develop consistent methodologies.
- Local Coordinators recruit volunteers to complete the count. Additional training of volunteers takes place both at the local level in person and at the state level through the use of webinars.
- Beginning in 2014, HUD refined the count and added sub-populations beyond the general count including households that met the definition of chronically homeless, veterans, and unaccompanied youth.
- The weather conditions can dramatically impact a count. When there are severe winter storms and below freezing weather, which does occur in the northern counties, it can be difficult to conduct a robust count.

Both the shelter and unsheltered counts use two primary data points—the count of households and the persons in those households. The following charts provide an overview of the persons and households counted in the BOSCOG geographic area 2013-2016. (Note for 2014, an unsheltered count was conducted in the summer. This data is not included because HUD would not accept it as an official count.)

As indicated:

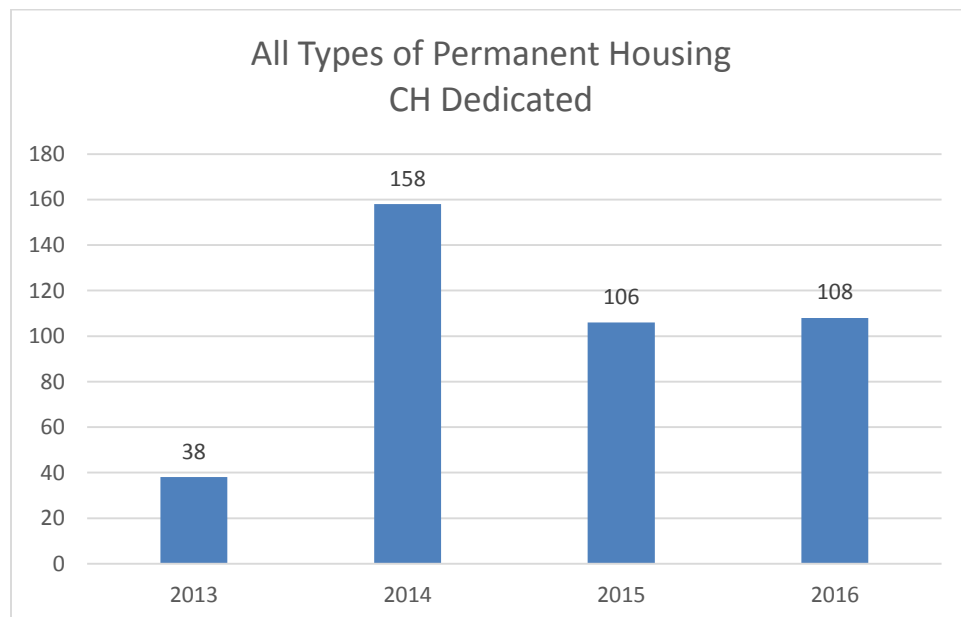
- The number of households and persons in in Emergency Shelter have decreased since 2014.
- The number of households in Transitional Housing have decreased since 2014. The number of persons, however has fluctuated.
- The number of persons (6.7%) and households (2.8%) counted during the unsheltered count decreased from 2015 to 2016.

Households/Persons who meet the definition of Chronically Homeless

Persons who meet the definition of chronically homeless started to be counted in 2014. The following provides a summary of this sub population counted in the BOSCOG.

Additionally, most households that meet the definition of chronically homeless are housed in permanent housing particularly permanent supportive housing. The following chart indicates the number of beds that were dedicated to households that met the definition. This does not reflect the actual number of persons housed. HUD has continued to refined the process of categorizing beds. In 2014 some beds were counted both as CH and Veteran. Beginning in 2015 beds were categorized differently which resulted in a reduction of “dedicated” beds. It is important to remember that with the implementation of Housing First and the use of the VI-SPDAT, the priority is to place households that are considered chronically homeless first.



As indicated:

- In 2015, the BOSCOG placed increasing emphasis on housing households that met the Chronic Homeless (CH) definition. This effort included the system wide implementation of coordinated entry using the VI-SPDAT assessment tool for triage and contract requirements to house CH households as a priority when vacancies occur. The data indicates that this priority change has been effective in

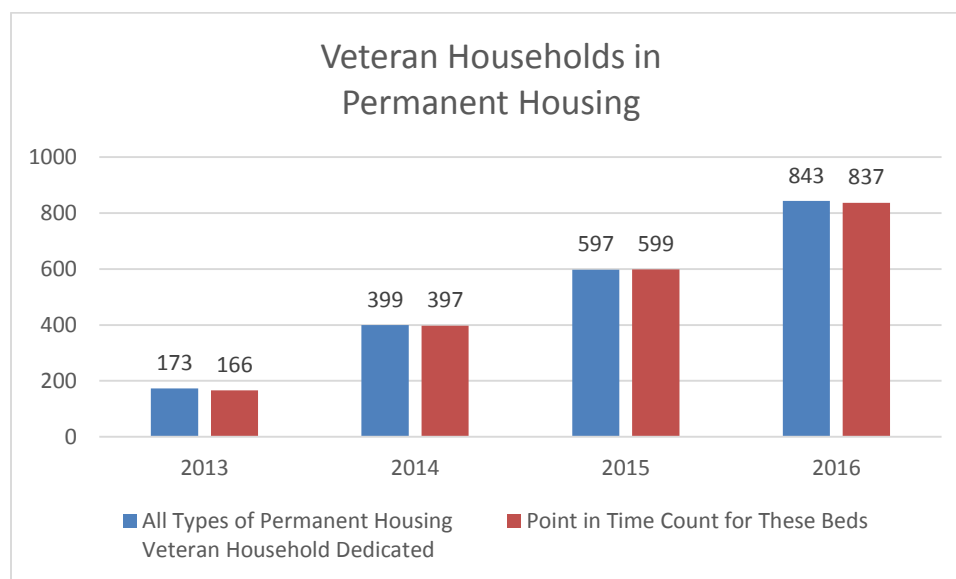
increasing the number of persons who are moving into housing and a decrease in the number of CH households who were homeless at the point in time count.

Veterans

HUD began requiring the count of veterans in 2014. The following provides an overview of veterans counted since 2014.

Veteran households are primarily housed in other types of permanent housing including PSH, SSVF/RRH, and VASH. The following chart indicates the number of permanent housing beds and the utilization for the night of the count in the particular year.



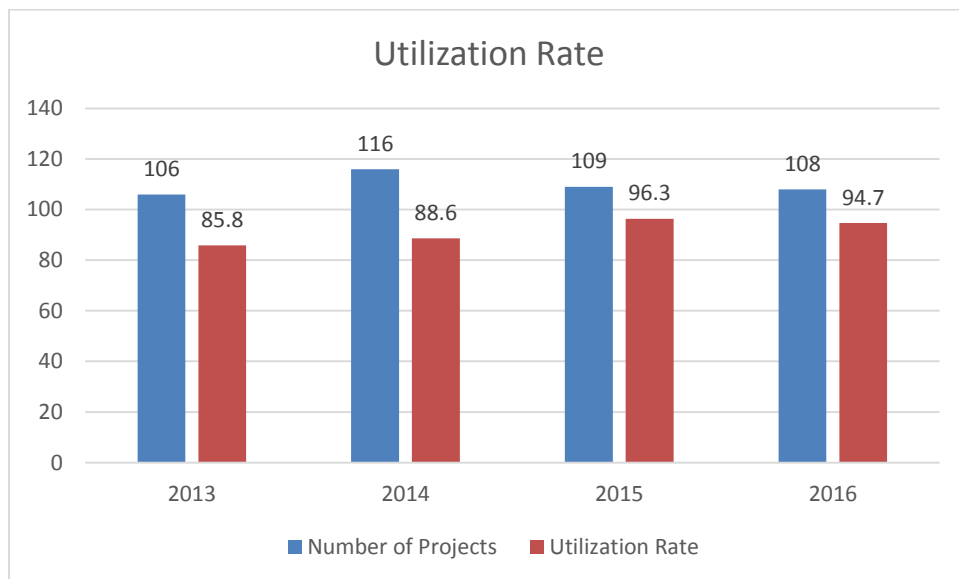
As indicated:

- There has been an increasing emphasis to house veteran households. During the past three years, the BOSCOC has seen an increase in resources such as VASH (Veteran focused housing vouchers) and SSVF/RRH options for veterans. These resources combined with the BOSCOC priority of housing veteran households resulted in a 52.8% decrease of unsheltered veterans in 2016.
- There has been approximately a 400% increase in the number of beds available for veterans between 2013 and 2016.
- In the case of SSVF/RRH and VASH, the number of beds and the number of persons housed will always be equal. However, prior to the ramp up of veteran housing, the BOSCOC established some veteran only projects. In these cases, vacancies or over utilization can occur.

Housing Inventory

The following table and bar graph provides an overview of the number of projects, number of beds and how many beds were occupied at the point in time date from 2013-2016. This information includes all types of projects.

Considerations:

- The number of projects fluctuates from year to year as new projects were added or consolidated. In addition, projects that do not participate in HMIS fluctuate as well. Projects may not provide information each year. As an example HUD required that the Veterans' Domiciliary (in Prescott) be included in prior year counts but excluded for the count in 2016.
- The number of beds available may fluctuate due to Fair Market Rents.
- Total number of beds may include beds that were added to accommodate seasonal needs (i.e. winter/summer specific beds, overflow).

2016 SHELTERED Housing Inventory and Point in Time Count

Sheltered Count – Persons staying in emergency shelter including domestic violence shelters, living in housing provided by a transitional housing or permanent supportive housing program were included in the 2016 point in time count. Persons and beds are counted regardless of whether the program received funding from HUD or not. If agencies enter data in HMIS, that data is used in the count. If agencies do not participate in HMIS, ADOH requests those organizations complete a brief survey. The highlights of the count are as follows:

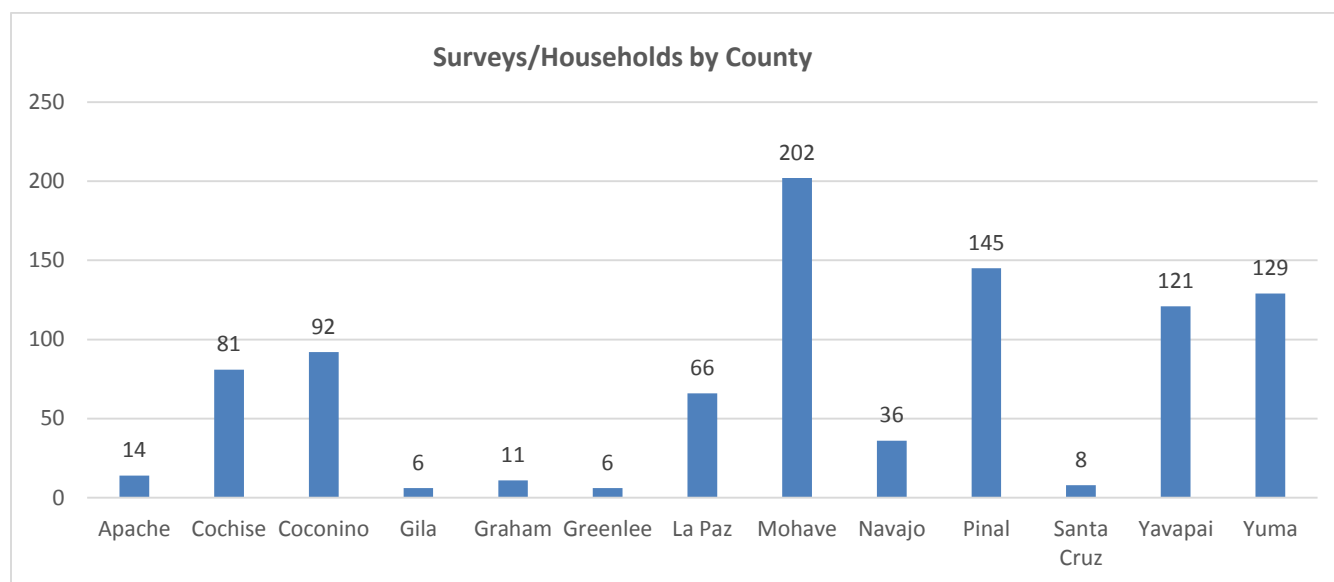
- Across project type, utilization rates were high. Emergency Shelter had the lowest at 84.73. Because emergency shelter is opportunistic, it is difficult to plan for utilization.
- With the addition of RRH units dedicated to Veterans, this type of housing has increased in the BOSCO. Best practices show it to be an important part of the continuum.
- All types of permanent housing are being utilized effectively throughout the continuum.

Unsheltered Count

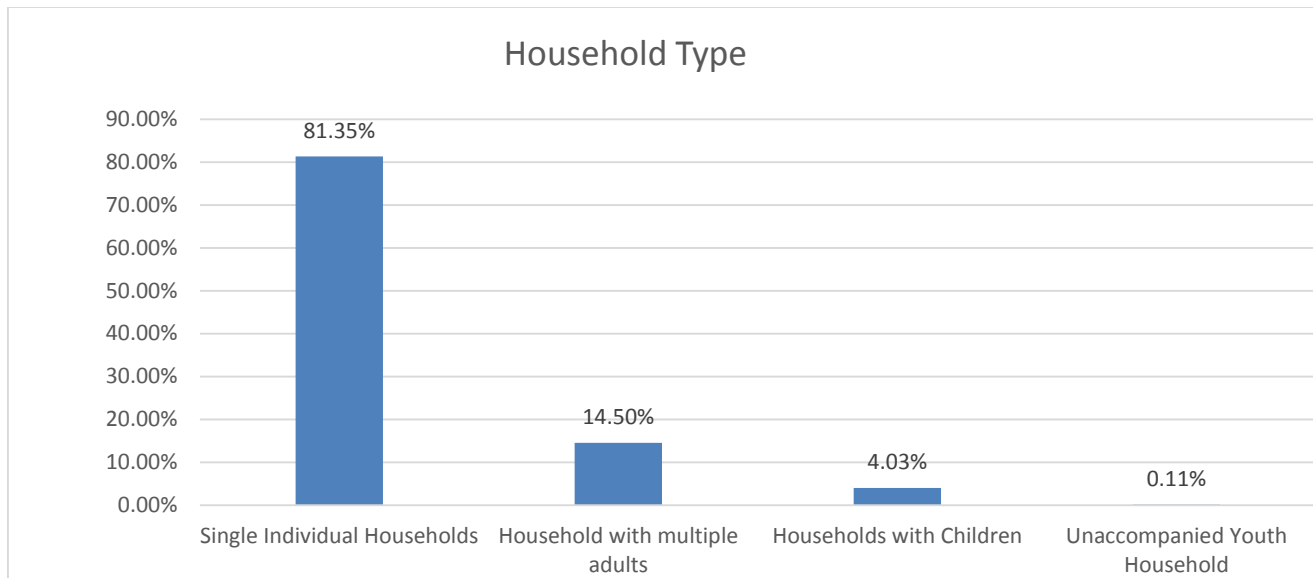
Arizona conducted the unsheltered count during the last week in January 2016. Persons were interviewed for the count from all thirteen counties in the continuum. There were coordinators in each county who recruited and organized 241 volunteers to conduct the count. This was an increase of 17.5% over the 205 volunteers who participated in 2015. Volunteer training was also enhanced in 2016. Volunteers were able to participate in a statewide webinar as well as in-person training conducted locally. The training provided information about how to approach people, ask the survey questions, and complete the VI-SPDAT.

In addition to the administration of the point in time unsheltered survey tool, volunteers were asked to administer the VI-SPDAT with individuals who indicated they were a veteran and/or indicated they may meet the chronic homeless definition. A total of 100 VI-SPDATS were completed. Since then all of the assessments have been entered into HMIS and by name lists have been generated for providers to conduct outreach and follow up.

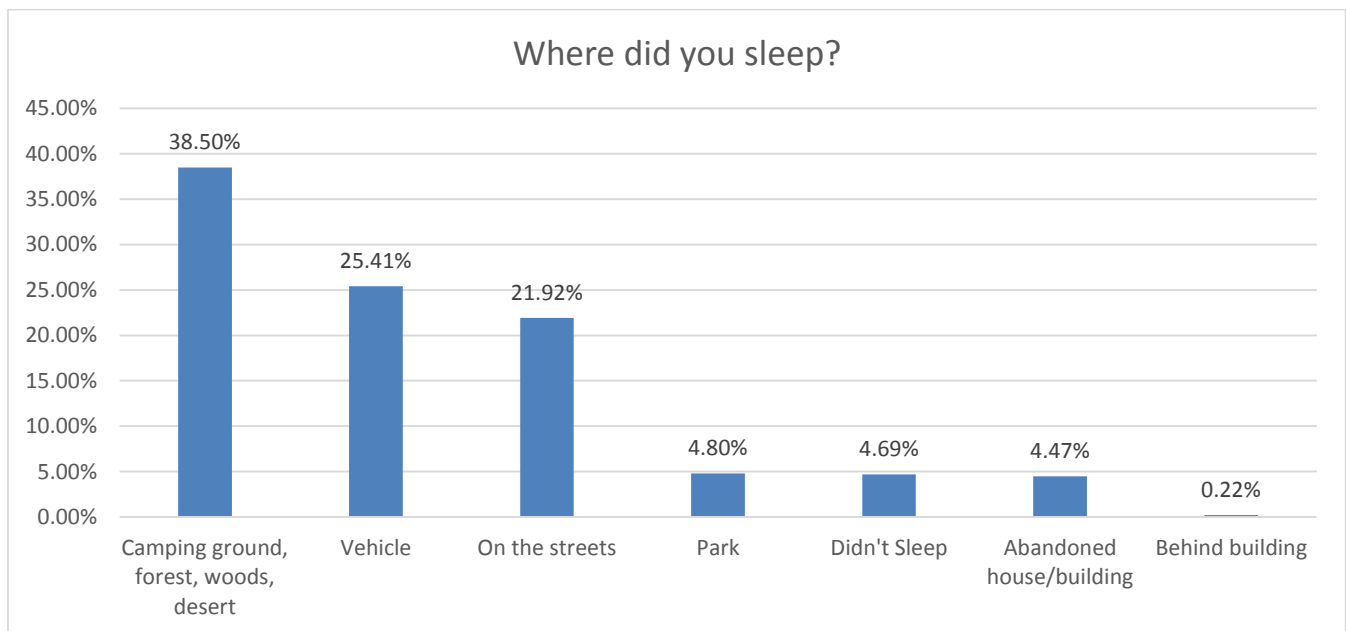
Methodology: Persons who came to locations such as feeding programs were asked if they would participate in a brief survey which provided the data for the count. Volunteers and agency staff also outreached to locations where individuals gather including encampments in the desert, forests, or mountains. Persons who participated were offered a small token of thanks such as socks and/or hygiene items for participating. A total of 917 surveys were included in the final unsheltered count. Surveys that were not used in the final unsheltered count included individuals who reported that they had spent the previous night in a shelter, in a friend's home, or in a motel room among others. Surveys that did not provide sufficient information were also not included. Only persons who slept in a place not meant for human habitation, such as a car, on the street, in a riverbed, in the forest or some similar location were counted. In 2016, persons were counted in all 13 counties in the BOSCOG geographic region. The following provides an overview of the surveys collected by county:



The 917 households included in the survey had a total of 1,217 individuals in those households. This is a **reduction of 6.7%** from 2015. The majority of persons were single person households. The following provides an overview by type of household (“unaccompanied children” is defined as children who present as a household):

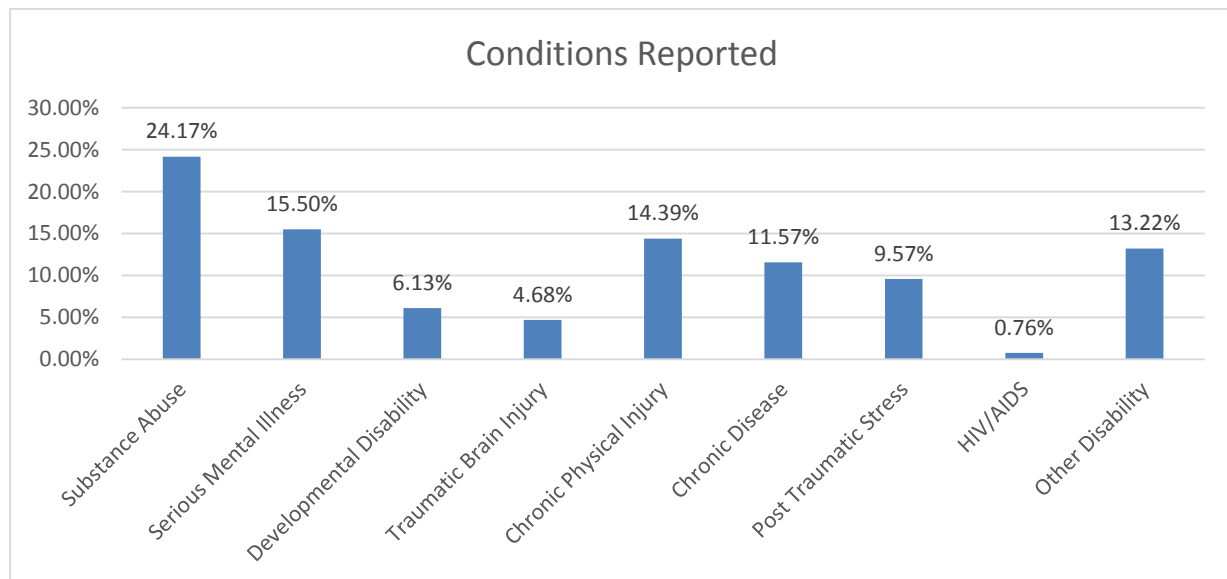


Persons slept in a variety of locations on the night before they participated in the count. The majority of persons were camping out in the forest, mountains or desert, staying in a vehicle or were on the streets. The following provides a summary of where individuals indicated that they spent the night before the count:

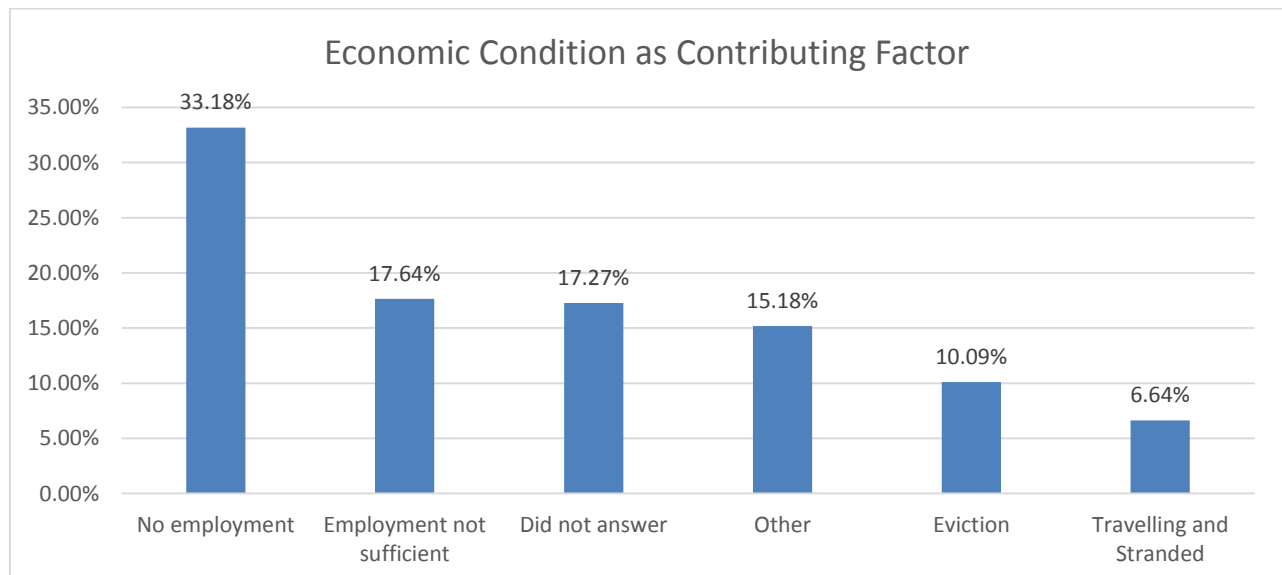


- 89.48% of all persons included in the survey were over 24; 5.18% were between 18 and 24, and 5.34% were under 18.
- The majority of individuals were male (70.83%), with females being 28.76%. Less than 1% of individuals counted identified as transgender.
- 13.48% of all individuals in households were Hispanic.

- The majority of persons in households identified as White (75.68%) followed by Native Americans (16.35%). Additionally, 2.71% were African American, .25% were Asian, and .25% Hawaiian. A total of 4.77% identified as multiple races.
- The majority of persons (42.64%) have experienced homelessness for more than 24 months. The next highest category was those persons who have experienced homelessness between 1 and 6 months (16.47%).
- 18.58% of all adults counted indicated they had served in the armed forces.
- 19.5% of persons indicated they had been victims of domestic violence.
- Individuals reported multiple conditions with substance use (24.17%) being the most frequently reported followed by a serious mental health issue (15.50%). (Individuals were able to report multiple conditions.)



- Unemployment and insufficient employment continue to be major causes of homelessness



Key Considerations

- Local communities need to review emergency shelter (including domestic violence shelters) utilization. Although high at 84.73%, it would appear that there is some opportunity for increasing efficient utilization.
- The BOSCOC experienced a reduction in the number of persons homeless for the first time since 2013.
- The use of Coordinated Entry and the Housing First philosophy are contributing to households in the BOSCOC finding appropriate housing.
- Prioritizing those who are experiencing chronic homelessness and those who are Veterans is having a positive effect in reducing the number of persons who are homeless.
